**Pupil Premium/Free School Meals Staff will be available to assist with on-line applications on Parents Evenings. Please remember to bring your National Insurance Number with you.**

Do you receive any of the following benefits?

- Income Support.
- Income based Jobseeker's Allowance.
- Income related Employment Support Allowance.
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit.
- Child Tax Credit - as long as you have a yearly household income of less than £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs) and do not get Working Tax Credit.
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit).
- Universal Credit

If you are receiving any of the above I am urging all parents to apply for Free School Meals, even if your child is receiving a Universal Free Meal in Reception and KS1 because additional money (called Pupil Premium) is given to schools to buy equipment and resources for children of parents eligible to receive the benefits listed above.

**All Saints pupils are missing out on crucial funding to support their learning.**
