
We are inviting Year 6 parents to a meeting on Monday 5th February to discuss several issues over their final seven months at All Saints.

Remember we launched our Food Strategy back in November, and there are 5 pledges in the pupils' manifesto. You should all have the booklet at home, but here they are again . . .

Waste

Tuck Shop

Instead of selling snacks and wrapped goods, children will offer fruits and vegetables. Items such as carrots and cucumbers will be chopped and prepared

Prayer and Liturgy

Following Jesus

"I will make you into fishers of men" Mark 1:14-20

Jesus called the first disciples to follow him, and they left everything and went with him. Today each of us is called to follow Jesus by sharing God's love with everyone as he taught us.

Gospel Mark 1:14-20

After John the Baptist had been arrested by Herod, Jesus began to preach to the crowds and proclaim the good news. One day while walking beside the sea of Galilee he saw Simon Peter and his brother Andrew casting their nets to catch fish.

Jesus called out to them 'Come, follow me and I will make you fishers of people.' The brothers left their nets and followed him. Further along the shore Jesus saw James and his brother John who were mending nets with their father Zebedee.

Jesus called them too, and at once they left their father and followed him.

The names of the brothers who left their boats and nets to follow Jesus were Simon Peter and Andrew; James and John. He asked them to follow him and become 'fishers of people'.

Jesus needed someone to help him with proclaiming the Good News of God, and to carry on his work when he had returned to his heavenly Father. These men would help him to lead people back to God, and to teach others of God's great love for them.

Many people followed Jesus and became his disciples, but Jesus chose a small number of them to carry on his work. Jesus chose twelve apostles. The name 'apostle' was given to a follower of Jesus who had been specially chosen. They were all close friends of Jesus, who were chosen to preach and perform miracles in his name. The names of the twelve apostles were:

Simon Peter, Andrew, James, John, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, (another) James, Thaddeus, Simon and Judas.

Jesus calls us to follow him too. When we are baptised into the Christian family we are called to be followers of Christ. But Jesus calls us to follow him every day.

To follow Jesus we do not usually have to leave home like the first disciples did! By loving God and our neighbour we can follow Jesus every day by living as Jesus taught us to.

Jesus, help us to follow you each day, So that in our own small way we can help to make our world a better place. Amen.


